P&T 100/25-26 Planning Decisions

The planning decisions report was noted.

P&T 101/25-26 Bere Road signage and Yellow Bars

The Committee considered the report in respect to the update regarding Bere Road signage and matters regarding yellow bars and traffic calming.

The Deputy Clerk noted a recent discussion with a Community Speed Watch member regarding how best roads identified by the Town Council with potential speeding could best be triaged to the Community Speed Watch group and the group's recommendation that residents keep a month-long diary of speeding issues in the first instance to be reported to the Community Speed Watch group. Cllr Cotton noted her willingness to encourage residents on Bere Road to keep such diaries to support in Speed Watch being able to monitor this part of Bere Road.

Cllr B Dean noted that there had been a police presence on Bere Road monitoring the speed of passing vehicles and enquired whether the Police had been approached regarding whether their data collection could be shared with the Town Council or if this had been included within the data from Dorset Council. The Deputy Town Clerk noted that only Police road collision data had been included from the data Dorset Council. Cllr B Dean asked whether the Police could be approached to see if they hold speeding data for Bere Road beyond the collision data.

It was **RESOLVED** that Cllr Cotton encourage residents to keep diaries of speeding they witness on Bere Road to be fed back to the Community Speed Watch Group.

It was **RESOLVED** that the Deputy Town Clerk enquire whether Dorset Police hold speeding data for Bere Road.

It was **RESOLVED** that Wareham Town Council would await indicative speeding data from the Community Speed Watch group on Bere Road to inform whether a speed survey should be commissioned with a view to introducing traffic calming measures.

Cllr Robinson noted the content of a response received to the Committee's letter regarding Town Council consultation for tree preservation orders and their planning applications. Cllr Robinson noted that the Planning Authority would amend its wording against tree preservation order planning notices, changing it from "For Information Only" and would welcome Town Council input for trees of local and historical significance.

Purpose of Report:	To consider a response to the Dorset Council Licensing Consultation.	
Background:	Dorset Council launched a consultation in respect to its Licensing Policy on 17 November 2025. Licensing authorities are required by the Licensing Act 2003 to publish a Licensing Policy that they propose to apply when exercising their functions under the Act. The Statement must be published at least every five years and can be reviewed from "time to time" with any amended parts re-consulted upon. As the Planning and Transport Committee receives planning applications pertaining to licensing, and may consider applications from premises likely to be licensed in the future, the Licensing Policy Consultation has been brought.

Subject:	North Bestwall Road Speed Limit Reduction Request

Purpose of	To consider a request for support for a reduction in the speed limit on North		
Report:	Bestwall Road.		
Background:	A resident's request has been relayed to the Town Council by Cllr Budd to consider its support for the reduction in the speed limit on North Bestwall Road.		
	The resident's concerns centre around the speed at which vehicles currently travel down the road.		
	Officers have investigated the matter in consultation with Dorset Council and brought their findings for the Committee's consideration.		
Key Points:	Unadopted road:		
	North Bestwall Road is an unadopted road. Unadopted roads are not maintained by Dorset Council and are ordinarily managed by either the landowner(s), the frontages (property owners on the road) or a management company in some instances.		
	As Dorset Council does not hold responsibility for the road's maintenance or management, Dorset Council can neither enforce a speed limit on the road nor does Dorset Council hold data for the current speed limit, though it is understood to be informally 30mph given its adjacency to another 30mph road.		
	 The request is to reduce the limit on North Bestwall Road. Though specifics of the aspired reduction have not been confirmed, officers understand the likelihood to be from 30mph to 20mph. 		
	As neither Dorset Council does not manage, maintain or hold responsibility for the road, it cannot assist with such a request. Dorset Council would refer residents to owners of the road in the first instance, or Police if the speeding is felt to be serious.		
	Road Ownership:		
	Officers have investigated the road's ownership, with a view to being able to advise the resident to contact road's owner(s) to consider the request.		
	North Bestwall Road is not owned by a single entity in its entirety, making it challenging to identify who, or which parties, would need to be contacted or consulted.		
	Wareham Town Council owns approximately 80 meters of North Bestwall Road, from the beginning of the road from East Street / Bestwall Road to the entrance of the allotments. Beyond this part of the road, officers have been unable to ascertain ownership. The Rempstone Estate has confirmed that their boundary ends at the wall and neither the road nor elements of it belong to Rempstone Estate.		



There is a possibility that the remainder of the road is either private property of North Bestwall House or the road's ownership is divided amongst other frontages or by the former quarry near the site.

Vehicle Speed Concern:

North Bestwall Road is comparatively less used by vehicles with its users primarily consisting of residents of the houses, delivery vehicles and users of the allotments and Scout Hut. North Bestwall Road is also used by residents and visitors for walks in the adjoining woodland as well as some horse riders.

The Town Council has not received any recent prior reports of speeding along North Bestwall Road.

Given the condition of much of the road, its layout and the type of usage it is unclear whether much, if any, of the vehicle using the road would easily exceed 30mph.

As North Bestwall Road lacks segregated pavements, some of the vehicles may be perceived as though they are travelling more quickly.

Implications

Failure to act on or provide an acceptable response to speeding concerns raised by residents may lead to resident frustration towards the Town Council.

Supporting a speed reduction on this road and not others where residents have raised similar concerns may lead to resident frustration towards the Town Council.

Supporting a speed reduction which residents deem unfounded or heavy-handed may lead to resident frustration towards the Town Council.

Supporting a speed reduction in the first instance is unlikely to directly lead to the reduction in the speed of the road without considerable further negotiation with unknown parties.

There may be minor additional cost implications should the Council wish to support a speed reduction and then be asked to fund or contribute towards required materials to implement this. E.g. signage.

Recommendation

To consider whether the Committee supports the request for a reduction in the speed limit on North Bestwall Road in principle.

To recommend the resident in identifying the remaining road's owner(s) or overseer(s) to raise their concerns and seek mutual agreement of further action or contact the police if the resident feels speeding is a serious safety concern.
