

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF VARIOUS ROADS IN WAREHAM FOR A REMEMBRANCE PARADE

DORSET COUNCIL has issued a Notice under Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to prohibit the use of the following roads by cyclists, horse riders and all mechanically propelled vehicles, except those taking part in the event and emergency vehicles, to facilitate a public event on the highway.

On Sunday 9 November 2025 as follows:

9.30 - 10.15: Part East Street from the junction with Church Street to the junction with The Cross.

10:00 - 11:00: Part East Street from the junction with Church Street to the junction with The Cross; Part South Street from its junction with The Cross to the junction with St Johns Hill; St John's Hill from the junction with South Street to the junction with Church Green; Church Green from the junction with St Johns Hill to outside Lady St Mary Church.

12:00 - 13:15: South Street from South Bridge to the junction with The Cross; North Street from the junction with West Street to the junction with Shatters Hill; Part East Street from the junction with Church Street to the junction with South Street.

13:00 - 14:15: North Street from the junction with The Cross to the junction with Shatters Hill; East Street from the junction with The Cross to the junction with Church Street.

13:45 - 14:15: East Street from the junction with The Cross to the junction with Church Street.

There will be no signed alternative route for traffic on this occasion.
