The Town Clerk noted she had been approached by the owner of the Old Gas Works requesting support from the Town Council for the extension of condition one of the planning consent. The condition had specified the works must be commenced within 3 years, which was not feasible with Southern Gas Works requiring a minimum of 34 months to carry out removal of historic gas pipes to comply with Health and Safety requirements and timings. The support of the Town Council would be by way of letter for the owner to attach to their case to Dorset Council, which would return to the next meeting for noting.

The Town Clerk further noted that she had also discussed logistics for the roundel Wareham Town Crest, which was located on the side of the Old Gas Works building, to be delivered to the Wareham Men's Shed for restoration work. The owner had expressed that they would like the roundel to be returned to the building as it was a prominent site for it for those visiting the Town, and they were keen to have it restored.

In addition to the support and the roundel, the Town Clerk reported that during the meeting possible solutions to overcome accessibility issues in respect to the pavement width in front of the old gas works had been discussed which would be passed to Dorset Council for consideration.

It was **RESOLVED** to support the owner of the Old Gas Works in their request for an extension to condition one of the planning consent, and to delegate the writing of a letter of support to the Town Clerk, which would be included for noting at the next meeting, and to delegate the contact between the parties in respect of the roundel to officers.





Subject:	Government Consultation - A Railway Fit for Britain's Future

Purpose of Report:	To consider and agree a response to the "A Railway Fit for Britain's Future" government consultation.		
Background:	On 18 February 2025 the government launched a consultation inviting views from stakeholders in respect to the railway provision in the UK being brought into public ownership under "Great British Railway".		
	The full consultation paper can be found on the government's website on the following link https://www.gov.uk/government/consultations/a-railway-fit-for-britains-future/a-railway-fit-for-britains-future#leadership-for-britains-railways		
Key Points:	Not all elements of the consultation are intimately relevant to Wareham, ther are elements of the consultation which members might deem it prudent for th Town Council to have its views captured.		
	Condensed into bullets below are themes from the consultation for response Under each set of themes are recommended areas for members to consider in italics.		
	 The consultation seeks views on whether the Secretary of State should be responsible for the award of licences to organisations under GBR, as well as strategic decision making. Members are also asked whether GBR should be able to provide incentives and use regulatory powers through its reforms. 		
	Members may wish to consider whether the Secretary of State is the official they wish to see overseeing GBR decision making or whether other key officials should be given joint oversight.		
	The consultation seeks views on the proposed functions of a new "passenger watchdog", whether this should be an advisory body or a regulator and whether the current Rail Ombudsman should become part of the new "passenger watchdog".		
	Members are strongly recommended to consider in their response to broaden the scope of any proposed watchdog to encompass all elements of public interaction with the rail network including passengers, train stations and wider rail infrastructure.		
	This stance may support in having an advisory/regulatory body which may consider impacts of rail network decision making, such as the closure of level crossings on communities, rather than just passenger experience.		
	The proposed advisory/regulatory functions can be seen in appendix 1.		

	Members may wish to consider suggesting making a new watchdog a regulator to give it more powers of enforcement, as well as incorporating the current Rail Ombudsman within it.
	The consultation seeks views on capacity issues pertaining to freight and business traffic on the rails.
	Members may wish to respond to these elements more neutrally given their limited direct impact on Wareham.

RE OLD GAS WORKS - WAREHAM

Further to our meeting on Tuesday, I presented your timing of works dilemma to the Planning and Transport Committee, explaining the time constraints placed on you by Southern Gas Networks (SGN) and the impact this will have on your ability to comply with condition 1 of the planning consent.

As a result, the Committee wished to express its support for you in approaching Dorset Council to have condition 1 extended to 5 years to enable the SGN works to be completed in their specified timescale and allowing time to commence building works in a realistic timeframe. The Committee's view was that it would be detrimental to the whole project if the condition was not amended as it would simply not be possible to achieve the 3-year timescale.

The Committee was concerned that the development would fail without the extension of condition 1 in the planning consent because the work by SGN would be required regardless of who the owner or developer was. The development is vital for Wareham, as there is very little development available in the Town, and if Planners fail to see the importance of a minor change to a condition which is within its gift, it could result in the site never being developed. Something that Wareham Town Council, and the residents of Wareham, would be extremely disappointed to see.

I hope this letter will provide some level of weight to enable Dorset Council Planning to make the right decision for the Town and an important development within it.
