P&T 111/25-26 Dorset Council Licensing Policy

The Committee considered the draft Dorset Council Licensing Policy and its consultation documents.

The Committee noted concern that the draft Dorset Council Licensing Policy's public safety section under 4.14 stated that "capacity limits will not be imposed as a condition of the licence on fire safety grounds". It was highlighted that there was a direct relationship between the number of occupants of a building and the speed at which a building can be safely evacuated, and that the Committee may wish to note these concerns in its response.

It was **RESOLVED** that the Town Council respond to the Dorset Council Licensing Policy highlighting the Committee's considerations regarding 'Public Safety 4.14' and its support for the rest of the Licensing Policy.

P&T 112/25-26 North Bestwall Road Speed Limit Reduction Request

The Committee considered the resident's request for a reduction in the speed limit on North Bestwall Road and given the road's unadopted nature, it was unclear as to road ownership and the speeds road users could achieve given its condition.

Subject:	Bere Road Vehicle Speed and Yellow Bars Traffic Calming
Prepared by:	Sam Dickins, Deputy Town Clerk
Purpose of Report:	To consider the received vehicle speed data for Bere Road and the Committee's desired further action.
Background:	<p>The Planning and Transport Committee considered a speed indicator device request for Bere Road at its meeting on 14 October 2025 under P&T 082/25-26 and signage and yellow bars for Bere Road at its meeting on 25 November 2025 under P&T 101/25-26.</p> <p>The Committee previously considered whether to commission a speed survey on Bere Road to potentially build a case for Dorset Council to introduce yellow bars as traffic calming but resolved to await indicative speeding data from either the Community Speed Watch group or Police before committing public money.</p>
Key Points:	<p>Speeding Data:</p> <p>Dorset Police have shared speeding data from their visits on Bere Road within the 30mph zone. This information is presented on the overleaf.</p> <p>Dorset Police visited the site 16 times over 8 months spending a cumulative total of 21¼ hours monitoring speeds.</p> <p>Dorset Police observed 201 cars exceeding the speed limit. This is an average of 1 car exceeding the speed limit every 6.3 minutes during the Police's visits.</p> <p>Potential escalation:</p> <p>Given the prevalence of recorded speeding on Bere Road, a case for the implementation of traffic calming in the form of yellow bars could be made to Dorset Council if the Committee wished.</p> <p>Traffic Calming measures must be made and/or supported by a Town or Parish Council for consideration by Dorset Council. There is some guidance on the Dorset Council website¹ outlining the process, though exact thresholds and selection criteria are not explicitly listed.</p> <p>If the Committee instructs the Town Council to approach Dorset Council seeking yellow bars, Dorset Council may either:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Accept the Police speeding data as sufficient empirical data to meet criteria for traffic calming. (<i>This outcome appears likely given the data</i>)Or- Insist that the Town Council commissions a speed survey through Dorset Council to confirm the data's findings.

	<p>If the Town Council is required to commission a speed survey for Bere Road, this would come at an unbudgeted cost of £295 (excluding VAT). Authorisation for this expenditure would need to be sought from either Full Council or the Policy, Resources and Finance Committee.</p> <p>Suitability and potential traffic calming impact:</p> <p>A compelling case can be made to pursue traffic calming at Bere Road, given the high incidence rate of speeding from Police data, public requests for the Town Council to explore traffic calming and anecdotal concerns of safety along the road.</p> <p>Though Police collision data has not recorded a high level of collisions on the road, the high incidence rate of speeding does increase a likelihood of future accidents or collisions, be they between a singular vehicle, multiple vehicles or involving a vehicle and pedestrian.</p> <p>Yellow bars as a traffic calming measure are comparatively much more cost-effective to implement than other measures, such as speed bumps for example.</p> <p>Proximity of Speed Limits:</p> <p>Officers understand some 50mph signs are located near the beginning of the 30mph zone, which may be further compounding the speeding issues witnessed on the road. Councillors may wish to consider requesting that the 50mph signs are moved further away from the 30mph zone as part of any request to Dorset Council.</p> <p>Clarification:</p> <p>The data shared by Dorset Police is not considered sensitive or confidential.</p> <p>Dorset Police would like to impress upon readers that the data represents “activations” of their speed detection equipment indicating a vehicle exceeding the speed limit.</p> <p>This data does not directly equate to the number of tickets Dorset Police have issued on Bere Road. This data is to be understood as wholly separate from ticket issuing data.</p>
Implications:	<p>Failure to act on or provide an acceptable response to speeding concerns raised by residents may lead to resident frustration towards the Town Council.</p> <p>There is a nominal chance the Town Council may be required by Dorset Council to commit an unbudgeted £295 (excluding VAT) for the commission of a speed survey.</p>
Recommendation:	<p>To approach Dorset Council with Dorset Police’s speeding data on Bere Road to request the implementation of yellow bars as appropriate traffic calming and request the 50mph signs are moved further away from the 30mph zone.</p> <p>To consider whether the Committee would wish to recommend the expenditure to commission a speed survey at £295 (excluding VAT) to Full Council for approval, subject to this being a requirement for traffic calming on Bere Road to be pursued.</p>

Subject:	Church Street Traffic Management

Purpose of Report:	To consider a request for Town Council support for either a southbound one-way system or the construction of a build out for two-way traffic prioritisation.
Background:	<p>A resident has contacted the Town Council regarding traffic concerns in Church Street and requested the Council's assistance in implementing either a one-way system or having a build-out constructed to allow priority traffic two ways.</p> <p>Officers have investigated the feasibility of the request with Dorset Council colleagues and brought the request and officer findings for report to this Planning and Transport Committee.</p>
Key Points:	<p>The Town Council was contacted on 11 December 2025 regarding pedestrian safety concerns on Church Road, along with 2 resident proposals to address these.</p> <p>Resident's Concern:</p> <p>The resident's concern culminates around the busyness of the road and its safe usage by pedestrians given lacking pavement space and cane, wheelchair and walking aid user usage. The resident's original comments are included below.</p> <p><i>"Would like assistance from council in presenting a plan for safety changes to be made to Church Street traffic safety in line with either a) one way system from East Street driving toward Sainsbury's and beyond or b) creating a build out to allow priority traffic two ways also resulting in making safe this very, very busy road. We reside in the only home on this side of the street without a pathway and the pathway opposite is extremely dangerous to those of us that use either a cane, wheelchair, walker or other disability device for helping us to walk safely on either side. We have been collecting signatures locally in support of same."</i></p> <p>Feasibility of the proposals:</p> <p>Officers engaged colleagues in Dorset Council to understand whether the resident's proposals may be feasible, or if there are other options to address the reported concerns.</p> <p>Both proposals by the resident would involve substantial cost and can only be implemented by Dorset Council as Safety Schemes, which would require sufficient empirical data demonstrating a requirement for enhanced safety measures.</p> <p>Dorset Council colleagues have confirmed within the past 5 years no collisions or incidents which, in its view, warrant traffic calming or enhanced safety features have taken place in this street.</p>



	<p>Officers investigated with Dorset Council colleagues whether alternate measures could be implemented such as a “virtual footway¹” for areas of Church Street without a physical pavement.</p> <p>Dorset Council has confirmed that these are no longer implemented in Dorset due to safety concerns and in Dorset Council's view no other measures would be sensibly introducible.</p> <p>Similar Historic Reports and Strength of Feeling:</p> <p>Traffic issues in Church Street have been reported to both Wareham Town Council and Dorset Council respectively.</p> <p>The Planning and Transport Committee considered a request for a reduction in Church Street's speed limit to 10 Mph at its meeting on 16 November 2022 (Planning and Transport 437.²), resolving not to pursue the request as speeding may have been perceived rather than actual.</p> <p>While this shows a history of issues having been reported in relation to Church Street, it may only indicate that a number of neighbouring residents feel particularly strongly about the immediately adjoining street, rather than there being a pronounced hazard necessitating being addressed by Dorset Council.</p> <p>Within the resident's correspondence the ongoing collection of signatures for a petition in support of the proposals is noted. While this may indicate more clearly residents' strength of feeling in relation to this portion of Church Street, the two proposals are not implementable without sufficient empirical safety data and would likely not be accepted by Dorset Council.</p>
Implications:	<p>Failure to act on or provide an acceptable response to traffic concerns raised by residents may lead to resident frustration towards the Town Council.</p> <p>Pursuing traffic management or calming measures which Dorset Council deem unsuitable would be unproductive and may reduce Wareham Town Council's future credibility for future requests.</p>
Recommendation:	<p>To acknowledge the resident's request and respond that Dorset Council is unable to implement traffic management or calming measures on this street.</p>
